



## **Environmental Assessment and Permitting Specialist**

Woodfibre LNG Limited is proposing to build a 2.1 mtpa liquefied natural gas (LNG) plant and export facility at the former Woodfibre pulp mill site, on the West side of Howe Sound, seven kilometers southwest of Squamish, British Columbia (about a 1 hour drive North of Vancouver and accessible only by water).

The Woodfibre LNG plant is based on electrical power supplied by the local provider, BC Hydro, with large electrical motors used to drive the major machinery. The facilities will have level of automation and control consistent with a modern LNG plant based on advanced proven technologies.

Woodfibre LNG is currently looking out for an Environmental Assessment and Permitting Specialist to join our Team!

### ***Key Responsibilities:***

In the role of **Environmental Assessment and Permitting Specialist**, you will be working directly with Woodfibre LNG's Regulatory Specialist to define the regulatory and permitting approval process for Project implementation, and developing the overall Project permitting plan and schedules. The successful candidate will take ownership for the development and execution of project permitting needs post-Environmental Assessment, through to construction, including ensuring timely reporting of issues and mitigations to management. The successful applicant:

- Tracks progress of regulatory approvals and permits for the implementation of the Project; liaises closely with the project development team to assist in defining regulatory requirements and information required for the regulatory and permit submissions for the project; coordinates with the corporate affairs team on consultation and community outreach related to permitting matters; maintains overall permit list and status.
- Develops, maintains and meets budgets for regulatory permitting requirements.
- Supports Woodfibre LNG's Regulatory Specialist with liaison with the Provincial, Federal, Municipal Authorities and First Nations to establish regulatory requirements as it relates to applications, approvals and permits; is responsible for managing and tracking communications between parties in regards to applications, approvals and permits.
- Manages and works with consultants, contractors and Woodfibre LNG's Regulatory Specialist on preparation of environmental assessments and permitting applications, defining requirements, drafting and review of studies and applications.
- Coordinates with Woodfibre LNG's Regulatory Specialist, Woodfibre LNG's Construction Manager and Contractor(s) to plan and implement permit requirements or conditions; interfaces with project and corporate resources in the Company, and the EPC contractor, securing their participation and compliance with permits, commitments, corporate policies and procedures; meets reporting requirements to ensure all reporting deadlines are met.



- Is responsible for day to day interface with regulatory agencies to clarify requirements, establishes regulatory schedules, follows-up on questions from regulators, etc.; acts as liaison for information requests from various government agencies in regards to permits.
- Assists the Corporate Affairs team with the interface with local media, government, regulatory, First Nations and NGO groups; prepares for and participates in meetings with, and presentations to, internal and external stakeholders; assists the Company's activities towards its sustainability goals.
- Provides leadership through a personal commitment to influence overall safety behavior; demonstrates 100% compliance with company HSES policies and guidelines

***Requirements:***

- Degree or Diploma qualifications relevant for the position (environmental biology, ecology, engineering, resource management, or related environmental discipline);
- Demonstrated experience in BC environmental regulatory and permit management (5 to 7 years) for large natural resources or infrastructure projects;
- Experienced in government and regulatory approval processes for large natural resources or infrastructure projects, including current legislation at Municipal, Provincial and Federal levels;
- Experience working with large multi-disciplinary teams and contractors;
- Experience in permitting during post-Environmental Assessment and construction phases of project implementation would be an asset;
- Experience with BC OGC permitting would be an asset;
- Proven ability to work with a culturally diverse group of people including First Nations with a cooperative team-orientated approach;
- Familiar with typical environmental management plans, community plans and implementation plans to meet Environmental Assessment commitments; familiar with consultation requirements and processes as part of successful plan implementation;
- Exceptional written and verbal communication skills;
- Strong organization skills, ability to manage multiple tasks and a heavy workload;
- Expertise with a variety of computer programs (e.g. MS Office);
- Motivated and willing to take ownership of tasks;
- Energetic in pursuit of continuous improvement processes;
- Shares knowledge readily and encourages personal development;
- Available for business travel as required by company; and
- A valid BC driver's license and passport – this role will be based in our Vancouver office but will involve travel to and from Squamish, BC.
